After all the maple leaves you’ve seen, you’ve probably guessed that all things maple are dear to Canadian hearts. Today, enjoy an authentic taste of Canada – maple ice – in Trois Rivières in the heart of French Canada. Have lunch at Montmorency Falls... not quite as famous as the legendary cataracts you saw earlier on your Niagara Falls vacation, perhaps, but actually 98 feet higher. Continue on to Quebec City for a two-night stay at one of Canada’s most iconic hotels, Fairmont Le Château Frontenac. Fairmont Le Chateau Frontenac

A morning sightseeing tour of Quebec City – the hemisphere’s only walled city north of Mexico is accompanied by our local guide – it may give you the feeling that you just might not be in Canada anymore!
